Choosing Option 1 will connect you to the entry point for mental health services in the county by providing referral and linkage resources, mobilizing crisis response teams, and crisis intervention to residents in Los Angeles County. LACDMH see those with Medi-Cal, Medicare, Uninsured and Undocumented. This is available 24 hours 7 days a week.

Choosing Option 2 will connect you to the Emotion Support Line. This is available from 9am-9pm.

Choosing Option 3 will connect veterans and military family members to resources and provides access to a network of mental health professionals and military peer support. This is available from 9am-9pm.

Exodus Foundation For Recovery Urgent Care Center - UCC - MLK

A place for people with urgent mental health needs.

A 23-hour psychiatric crisis center open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year.

Crisis stabilization services include:

mental health assessment, medication evaluation and management, therapeutic interventions, social services and community referrals including a variety of discharge plans

Then you can help them by filling out an outreach request and alert us as to any specific concerns you may have regarding the person's well-being. As outreach capacity is limited, requests for those with more serious medical and/or mental health needs may be prioritized.

Due to high demand, it may take a few days for an outreach team to be deployed and we may need to prioritize those individuals who are most vulnerable. With nearly 40,000 people living on the streets of LA County, the need for outreach services is great.
